Distinguished Member Award



The recipient of this year's TPUG Distinguished member award is <u>John Mayo</u>. John is the Elsa Carlson McDonough Chair of Business Administration and Professor of Economics, Business and Public Policy in the McDonough School of Business at Georgetown University.

He is also a past TPUG President (2005 – 2006) and from (2014 – 2015). John has written extensively on the regulation of utilities, telecommunications and railroads – publishing over 50 papers and testifying before Congress, federal and start regulators over 30 times. In his acceptance speech at the 2023 ASSA meetings, John reflected on the long arc of research on transportation and public utilities and highlighted the important role of economics in addressing future regulatory challenges.

Dissertation Award Recipients



The recipient of the 2022 TPUG dissertation award is <u>Tal Roitberg</u> from the University of Southern California. Tal's dissertation focuses on the issue of urgency both in understanding commuters' travel choices and as it relates to optimal tolling. Using a combination of theoretical and empirical tools, he models drivers' decisions to use toll (Express) lanes and

estimates the value of urgency using toll and travel time data for Southern California highways. He finds "the commuters most susceptible to urgency leave home earliest and are therefore less likely to use the express lane, but they nonetheless benefit most from the option to pay to avoid late arrival."



Zakhary Mallett, also from the University of Southern California, was awarded honorable mention for his dissertation evaluating equity in rail transit fare policies. He first evaluates how costs and costs per rider vary across space and time for two transit rail networks. Then, bether cost receivery patterns and therefore transit subsidies vary across space and time.

he tests whether cost recovery patterns and therefore transit subsidies, vary across space and time. He documents differences in cost recovery patters for outlying areas compared with central areas of the networks.
